Education

Helping children and youth achieve their potential through education.

- Education is a valued partnership between families, schools and non-school providers that empowers parents to help their children succeed.
 - **School Readiness** – Children start school with the levels of health, physical, social, emotional, intellectual, language and literacy development skills needed for school success.
 - Address summer learning loss.
 - Improve access to quality, affordable child care and early learning opportunities.
 - ✓ % of kids entering kindergarten with age appropriate skills.
 - ✓ % of 4th graders who are proficient readers.
 - **Middle School Success** – Students successfully transition through middle school gaining the knowledge, skills and abilities they need for high school success.
 - Providing after-school and mentoring programs for at-risk youth.
 - ✓ # of kids involved in afterschool activities.
 - Provide students with access to system of smart wraparound supports.
 - ✓ # of kids involved in Healthy Families program.
 - **High School Graduation** – Students graduate high school on time prepared for college, work and life.
 - Partner with schools and parents to improve graduation rates.
 - ✓ % of kids who graduate high school on-time.
 - ✓ % of kids who obtain associates degree or equivalent technical training.
 - ✓ % of 19-24 year olds who are not working or in school.
 - Design and staff schools to boost student engagement and academic performance.

Income

Helping families become financially stable and independent.

- Individuals and families access basic needs from a proactive, prevention focused, comprehensive, easy-to-navigate system that fosters self-sufficiency and asset building.
 - Income Supports and Subsidies – Individuals and families enroll in the public, private and informal benefits for which they are eligible; benefits programs are structured to facilitate enrollment.
 - Support basic needs while increasing financial education.
 - ✓ % of working families that are lower income.
 - ✓ % of lower-income families who are financially unstable.
 - Savings And Assets – Families have access to and use financial products that help them build savings to deal with unexpected expenses and accumulate assets to support longer-term goals.
 - Help working families obtain job training and family-sustaining wages.
 - ✓ % of lower-income working families that have a checking or savings account with a minimum of \$300.
 - Affordable Housing – Safe, good quality housing units are available at a reasonable cost.
 - Increase affordable housing for seniors and families.
 - ✓ % of homeownership for lower-income working families.
 - ✓ % of lower-income working families that spend 40% or more of their income on housing.

Health

Improving people's health

- Individuals and families have easy to access and ample affordable high quality, preventable, immediate and follow-up health and dental care.
 - Safe Home and Community – Homes are free from violence and physical hazards; communities support people's health safety and development.
 - Reduce instances of child abuse and domestic violence.
 - Healthy Choices – Policies and practices in organizations, systems institutions, personal networks and neighborhood environments support healthy choices as the default choice for all individuals.
 - Reducing substance abuse.
 - ✓ % of students grades 9-12 who are healthy and avoid risky health behaviors.
 - Increase access to prenatal care
 - ✓ % of babies born who are born low birth weight.
 - Access to Health Care – Necessary services, including preventative mental and dental resources is accessible.
 - Increasing access to critical healthcare services.
 - ✓ Percentage of youth under 18 who are not covered by health care insurance.
 - Increasing health education and preventative care.
